MRS GINA RINEHART

Since becoming Executive Chairman of the Hancock Prospecting Group in 1992, Mrs. Rinehart has transformed the Group into one of the most successful private companies in Australia's history. Under Mrs. Rinehart's leadership, the Hancock Group has diversified from prospecting to include major investments in iron ore and other minerals, beef plus dairy and a property holding.

Mrs Rinehart's achievements include the development of the mega Roy Hill project, the exploration and studies of four major mines, then development at Hope Downs with joint-venture partner Rio Tinto, and the considerable expansion of Hancock's agricultural business – now the second largest producer of cattle in Australia – and owner of some of Australia's best wagyu breed,

producing top quality beef.

Mrs Rinehart's flagship executive chair achievement is the exploration, financing, construction and operation of the \$US10 billion Roy Hill project, now the largest single iron ore mine in Australia, and one of the largest mines in the world – the debt raised was the largest ever for a mainly greenfield land-based mining and infrastructure project anywhere in the world.

Mrs Rinehart's business endeavours and industry leadership have been recognised internationally and in her own country. She was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from Bond University, named Telstra Australian Businesswoman of the Year in 2009, CEO Magazine CEO and twice Chairman of the Year, which are in addition to numerous lifetime achievement awards and other awards.
